Fallopia japonica (Mexican Bamboo)

- Polygonaceae
- Hollow, jointed stems
- Invasive plant that grows by streams
- Fruit floats down stream
- Triangular leaves
- Characteristic of family is an ocera, a sheath that surrounds the leaf node







Rumex crispus (Curley Dock)

- Polygonaceae
- Leaf usually has scalloped edges





Lindera benzoin (Spice Bush)

- Lauraceae
- Oval leaves with a bluish cast
- Smells like Pine-sol
- Yellow flowers



Polystichum acrostichoides (Christmas Fern)

- Dryopteridaceae
- Evergreen
- Large leaves with many leaflets
- Orical at base of leaflet makes the leaflet look like a little ear or a boot.





Hepatica nobilis (Liver Leaf)

- Ranunculaceae (Butter Cup) family
- Purple flower with three lobed leaf



Hydrophylla sp. (Water Leaf)

- Hydrophyllaceae
- Compound leaf with water droplet like spots



Berberis thunbergii (Barberry)

- Berberidaceae
- Highly invasive plant from Japan
- Straight thorns







Duchesnea indica (False Strawberry or Indian Strawberry)

- Rosaceae
- Looks like strawberry but with rounded leaves and yellow flowers
- Large bracts on fruit



Hamamelis virginana (Witch Hazel)

- Hamamelidaceae
- Shrubby tree








Claytonia virginica (Spring Beauty)

- Portulacaceae
- 5 petals 2 sepals





Acer negundo (Box Elder)

- Sapindaceae
- Maple tree with compound leaves
- Large green twigs with opposite branching
- Found near water or in disturbed areas
- Often found in or near parking lots
- Often planted as a yard tree





[Vine] *Toxicodendron radicans* (Poison Ivy)

- Anacardiaceae (Cashew family)
- Vine with waxy drupes and branches
- Harry roots
- Rushuil oil causes blistering
- 3 leaves





[Tree] *Betula lenta* (Black Birch or Sweet Birch or Cherry Birch)

- Betulaceae
- Wintergreen smell when crushed
- Sweet sap
- Bark and leaves look like a cherry tree
- Tasseled flowers



Kalmia latifolia (Mountain Loral)

- Ericaceae (Heath family)
- Looks like a rhododendron but with a raised vein on upper side



Lycopodium sp. (Licopod or Club Moss)

Lycopodiaceae



Lycopodium digitatum (Creeping Ground Cedar)

• Lycopodiaceae



Smilax glauca (Green Brier)

- Smilacaceae
- Vine that climbs with double tendrils
- Waxy sheen on underside of leaf





Goodyear pubescens (Rattlesnake Plantain)

- Orchidaceae
- Often found under pine trees in acidic soils





Chimaphila maculata (Spotted Wintergreen)

- Ericaceae
- Green plant with white stripe
- Not spotted and does not smell like wintergreen
